



Mold for Parthenon frieze

Description

One of a set of nine plaster molds, which are a one-twentieth scale version of the Panathenaic frieze on the Parthenon representing a festival for Athena. This mold contains three registers of varying scenes: top - figures standing in a row carrying discs, middle - a series of standing figures, bottom - a set of seated figures facing different directions. Thomas Bruce, 7th Earl of Elgin (1766-1841), arranged for the original marbles to be brought from Athens to the British Museum in London. These casts were made especially for the Telfair through arrangements with the British Museum by Carl Brandt, Telfair's first director.
